# Open Access Journals

- Freely accessible scholarly content
- Hosted on the internet, but not necessarily hosted by internet discipline professionals

# What This Plugin Does

1. Define a submission with extra fields
2. Create metadata for harvesting
3. Allow creation of journals
4. Supply WordPress shortcodes for controlling submissions and display





# What It Can't Do

1. SEO (Semper Plugins' All In One SEO)
2. Self-submission (CAPTCHA plugin)
3. Participation in Digital Commons network  
(Never promoted)
4. Granular Usage Reports (Still available on request)
5. Collaborative Editing Tools (Never used)




# What It Does Better

1. Cross-post items
2. Instant creation of series
3. Complete control over customization
4. And of course...



# Much cheaper

- Digital Commons - nearly \$20,000 per year
  - \$3000 for a cosmetic redesign
- WordPress - Plugins + hosting = \$600/ 3 years
  - Redesign at will
  - Hosting covers other subdomains, including library main site
